Dear Residents:

The Fall season is approaching, and our area students have been back in school for about a month. This is always a great time of year for children as they get settled into a new school year adjusting from summer fun to their school schedules.

The City Council of Hedwig Village passed an ordinance extending the School Zone hours to 4:30 p.m. for Memorial High School and Spring Branch Middle school. School Zone hours are 7:00 a.m. 9:00 a.m. in the mornings and 2:00 p.m.-4:30 p.m. in the afternoons. This change was necessary because the middle school will be dismissing later in the day this academic year. I urge you to be very cautious while approaching and proceeding through any school zone. Also, please look for kids riding bikes and walking that are on their way to school but not yet in a school zone.

Below are a few tips for drivers when in and around a school zone:

Tips for drivers

- Stay alert.
- Watch for children who might run between vehicles.
- Be mindful of children at bus stops.
- Put away your cellphone.
- Slow down.
- Obey school zone speed limit signs and all traffic rules.
- Drive safely and slowly when you see a school bus.
- Drop off and pick up children in the designated areas.

Residents,

Though crime is up all around us, crime in Hedwig Village is down over 20% compared to the same period in 2020 and 2019. And we have almost no crime in the residential areas of Hedwig Village. A big part of this can be attributed to an aware citizenry, if you see something suspicious or out of place you call. Watching out for your neighbors and partnering with the police keeps crime away.

Lately, there has been an increase in mail thefts in the cities around us. These thefts have led to several identities being stolen. The best way to combat this is to install a locking mailbox. If you are unable to do this, remove your mail from the box as soon after delivery as possible.

From the Fire Chief

If you have driven past the fire station, on Corbindale Rd, you have seen we are not as far along as we had planned by now. We are hopeful to be completed with the station addition and renovation by November. We will advertise an open house as soon as we can.

After seeing an increase in the amount of time our ambulance spends at the hospital, the Fire Commission has allowed me to staff our second ambulance from 7 am to 7 pm. Due to the increase in Covid 19, area hospitals are again very busy, and our paramedics must stay with their patients until hospital staff assumes care. While we typically spend about 45 minutes at the hospital, times have soared to sometimes over 2 hours. Having the ambulance out of service for this amount of time puts our residents at significant risk.

Response times within the City of Hedwig Village continue to be outstanding. For life threatening medical calls, we will have firefighter/paramedics at your home within 3 and a half minutes. We also provide a fire response within that same time. I appreciate the support the community gives to our personnel. I look forward to seeing you at the station sometime soon.

Trees for Houston will donate trees for residents to plant in their yard. There will be several different species this year. Trees will be available on a first come, first serve basis.

Hedwig Village Police Department will also be on hand to accept your pill form only medication for proper disposal. The pills MUST be removed from all packaging.

The Villages recommend residents remain in their vehicle while dropping off items at the event.
