In February 2018, we had the following criminal incidents in the Residential District of Hedwig <u>Village:</u>

Auto Theft

On February 7, 2018, a Chevrolet Pick-up was stolen from the parking lot of the Memorial Grove Apartments.

Burglary

On February 1, 2018, a home under construction on Stonegate was burglarized. Two black males entered through the garage and opened the door into the house. The alarm sounded and the males fled. These two males have been involved in numerous thefts of high end appliances from homes under construction. No arrests have been made, but our detectives are working several leads.

On February 23, 2018, a resident of the Le Renaissance Apartments reported her apartment was broken into and several small items were stolen.

Identity Theft

On February 2, 2018, a resident of the Le Renaissance Apartments reported his personal information was used to open a bank account.

Theft

On February 10, 2018, at about 1am, a Hispanic female asked for money from a homeowner on Echo Lane. After being refused, the female left in a small unknown vehicle taking a lawn ornament with her.

On February 13, 2018, two rings were stolen from a home on Hedwig Circle. Detectives determined a contractor stole the rings. Both rings were recovered and the suspect was arrested and charged with Felony Theft.
