

Crime Report – June 2016

Residents of Hedwig Village,

You are receiving this Crime Report because you are on the city of Hedwig Village email list. It is meant to provide you with information on what is taking place in your community. In June 2016, we had the following criminal incidents in the Residential District of Hedwig Village:

Auto Theft

On June 11, 2016, a resident of the Le Renaissance Apartments reported that his motorcycle was stolen from the complex parking lot some time during the night.

Criminal Mischief

On June 28, 2016, a newly built fire pit was damaged due to a construction contractor dispute at a residence on Hickorywood. The suspect has been charged with Criminal Mischief and is pending arrest.

On June 29, 2016, the door lock on a parked vehicle was damaged in the parking lot of the Le Renaissance apartments.

Theft from a Motor Vehicle

On June 27, 2016, the rear camera was stolen from a vehicle parked on Capri Street.

In the Commercial Districts, we had the following criminal incidents in June 2016:

- 3 Criminal Mischief (damage to property)
- 9 Thefts (7 shopliftings, 2 other thefts)
